- The Parent Facilitator and PTA will distribute volunteer information and training to parents.
- Ask parents to complete a parent interest survey in order to gather information from parents concerning the activities they feel would be most beneficial in their efforts to support their child academically.
- Parents will have an opportunity to view and receive a copy of the 2023-2024 Parent and Family Engagement Information packet.

Communication

- Conduct effective two-way communications from school-to-home and from home-to-school about school
 programs and student progress using PBIS, ParentLink, and social media (Facebook/Twitter). Upon request
 and to the extent possible, McDermott Elementary School will provide communication in the language that
 parents can understand.
- Distribute parental involvement surveys to all parents at the beginning and end of the year; information gathered will be used to develop parental involvement goals and objectives for the school year.
- The Parent and Family Engagement Information Packet will be distributed during registration as well as uploaded to the McDermott website. Parents will be able to access the Parent and Family Engagement Plan and Packet on the website at any time during the school year.
- The Parent Facilitator and PTA will distribute volunteer information and training to parents.
- The Staff, Principal, and PTA will distribute fliers, bulletins, and informational letters to all parents. An
 informational bulletin board and parent link will also be maintained for parents to view. Information included will
 consist of school policies and procedures, staff telephone numbers, school news, district news, a calendar of
 monthly activities, parenting tips, community news, and nutritional health information.
- The school website and eSchool which include pertinent school information and individual student information will be available for parents to view. Parents can access eSchool by using an individual pin number. eSchool contains individual grades and classroom assignments.
- The teachers are required to have two Parent/Teacher conferences per school year to discuss academic and behavioral progress of individual students.
- During parent teacher conferences, parents may have the opportunity to review and sign off on the McDermott Parent & Family Engagement Plan.
- The teachers will provide daily communication folders, and interim reports every fourth week if needed, and report cards every nine weeks to parents which explain individual student academic and behavioral progress. Communication folders, and interim reports require parental signatures. Also, parents are encouraged to

include any comments or questions. (If you have questions, comments, or concerns, please contact your child's teacher.)

- The principal, teachers, and other staff members will utilize PBIS Rewards App, e-mail, individual conferences as needed, and telephone calls to communicate individual student academic and behavioral progress to parents.
- The staff, principal, and PTA will provide opportunities for parents to participate in various parental workshops during the school year.
- The principal will provide an informational letter to parents explaining McDermott's academic level as it relates to School Improvement status and School wide Title I Plan.
- The staff and PTA will work together to provide instruction to parents regarding incorporating developmentally
 appropriate learning activities in the home environment including without limitation: role play demonstrations by
 a trained volunteer, accessing and using the Department of Education website tools for parents, assistance with
 nutritional meal planning and preparation and other strategies or curricula developed or acquired by the school
 district for at-home parental instruction approved by the Department of Education.

Building Staff Capacity

- The teachers will hold two parent/teacher conferences per school year for individual students to explain and engage parents in a discussion concerning academic and behavioral progress, interventions, test scores, and suggestions of how the parent can help their child at home. Statements regarding how the parent plans to help their child will be completed on the parent/teacher conference form.
- Prepare Family Informational Packets that will be sent home with students to include:
 - o McDermott Parent and Family Engagement Plan
 - McDermott Handbook
 - o Strategies for effective parent/teacher collaboration
 - Parent Survey of parent interests/needs
 - o Opportunities for parent/family engagement to support school community and education of children
 - Tentative calendar of events
 - Parent suggestion sheets on how to foster children's success at school
- Plan various activities throughout the school year to build staff and parent capacity to strengthen our school community and parent/family communication. The dates/times in this schedule are subject to change during the school year based upon the flow of the year.
- The staff and PTA will work together to provide instruction to parents regarding incorporating developmentally
 appropriate learning activities in the home environment including without limitation: role play demonstrations by
 a trained volunteer, accessing and using the Department of Education website tools for parents, assistance with
 nutritional meal planning and preparation and other strategies or curricula developed or acquired by the school
 district for at-home parental instruction approved by the Department of Education.
- The staff and PTA will recruit volunteers, mentors, and tutors to support instruction in the classroom through programs such as VIPs Reading Buddies, Encouragers, Intersection, Mount St. Mary's tutors.
- The staff will work with middle schools to provide a smoother transition from elementary to middle school by providing students and parent's information as needed.
- The staff, parents, and students will develop a school-parent-student compact. This compact will detail
 information concerning how all participants will share in the responsibility for improving student academic
 achievement through a partnership striving to help students achieve the state's high academic standards. All
 stakeholders will sign the compact (available digitally).
- The staff will invite parents and community members to meetings and workshops concerning school

Parental Concerns

School Complaints Resolution Process

There may be times when parents find they have concerns with their child's school or education. McDermott Elementary School encourages parents to raise any issues they have so that they can be dealt with promptly and resolved to the satisfaction of all concerned in the most appropriate manner.

McDermott Elementary School has developed the following complaint resolution procedures that provide parents with guidelines to assist them in addressing their concerns. These protocols provide a framework that ensures parent concerns are treated seriously and that all issues raised are addressed promptly and fairly while adhering to high standards of conduct and concern.

Guidelines for Parents

Level One: Contact Teacher/Guidance Counselor

It is important to address an issue or concern quickly; therefore, you should contact the person most directly involved with your child regarding the matter of concern. For example, contact the physical education teacher if the concern is related to physical education; the math teacher if the concern is related to math; the counselor if it is a personal issue; etc. Please direct all concerns related to social interactions or overall academic engagement/ performance to your child's Counselor.

Calling the school and leaving a message for the person to return your call is one way to make contact. You can also send a note or email to the appropriate campus personnel requesting a conference with the teacher or counselor. Be sure to state whether you are requesting a personal conference, a phone conference, or perhaps simply a written reply from the person regarding your concern. Please allow two school days for a response.

Level Two: Meet with the Principal

If a parent still has concerns after contact with a teacher/counselor, make an appointment to speak with the building principal. If a classroom teacher is to be present, it is more convenient for a meeting to occur during planning or team time. It is the principal's role and obligation to follow up on all parent concerns and to keep communication open. The principal will investigate the issue and consider all options to determine appropriate action for a satisfactory outcome.

Level Three: Contact the Associate Superintendent for Elementary Education

If the parent still has concerns, you may wish to discuss it further with the Associate Superintendent for Elementary Education, who can provide additional advice and support to seek a positive solution. The Associate Superintendent can be contacted through the Little Rock School District Office at 447-1000

Epstein's Six Types of Parent Involvement Keys to Successful Partnerships

Type 1: Parenting

Assist families with parenting and other child-rearing skills, understand child and adolescent development, and setting home conditions that support children as students at each grade level. Assist school in understanding families.

Type 2: Communicating

Conduct effective communications from school -to-home and from home-to school about school programs and student progress.

Type 3 Volunteering:

Organize volunteers and audiences to support the school and students. Provide volunteer opportunities in various locations and at various times.

Type 4 Learning at Home:

Involve families with their children on homework and other curriculum-related activities and decisions.

Type 5 Decision Making:

Include families in school decisions and develop parent leaders and representatives.

Type 6 Collaborating with the community

Coordinate resources and services from the community for families, students, and the school, and provide services to the community.
