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What Is Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is two different things:

It's a job. But it's also school.

Mostly, though,

it's a great opportunity!

An apprenticeship is a good way to prepare yourself for the future with on the job training in a highly skilled career.

An apprenticeship is a paid job.

Someone who is new to the field (the apprentice) learns the skills needed for the job. Apprentices are trained by master craftsmen, who are experts in their field. They share their skills and knowledge to help the apprentice become an expert too.

An apprenticeship is also a school.

Apprenticeships include classroom lessons to make sure the apprentice masters all aspects of the job.

What Does It Mean To Be An Apprentice?

Apprenticeship is one of the oldest methods of career preparation, It means "you earn while you learn"!

Apprenticeship comes in all shapes and sizes. There are over 1,000 different occupations that can utilize the apprenticeship model, such as *plumbing*. A plumbing apprentice spends some of the time in the field being paid to learn the trade and some of the time in a classroom for related training. It takes a minimum of four years to acquire the necessary hours and skills needed to complete the plumbing apprenticeship program. Upon completion, the plumb-

ing apprentice will ALREADY have a job and a career, hold a nationally recognized credential, may be on track to a university degree, or have become a leader in the plumbing industry and normally free of student loan debt.

Why Are Apprenticeship Programs So Successful?

Statistics have proven that apprentices are more motivated, learn their jobs faster, have lower attrition, are more loyal to the employer who provided training, and are more likely to become supervisors than workers trained in other ways. In addition, apprenticeship provides:

PAID on-the-job training – Apprentices benefit from real-world application while receiving training based on industry standards. Apprentices "earn while they learn." There is no better person to train the apprentice than the employer. They have the equipment and knowledge to train the apprentice based on their specific needs.

Mentoring – Apprentices are under the direct supervision of a journeyman or master. The mentor is a highly qualified person who is proficient in their field.
